Esitys työsopimuksen tekemiseksi Leena Heinämäelle ja Hossain Kamrulille tutkijatohtorin tehtäviin

Lapin yliopiston ja Arktisen keskuksen välisissä kurkistusneuvotteluissa 26.3.2015 sovittiin, että tutkijatohtori Leena Heinämäen tehtävä vakinaistetaan ja että Kamrul Hossain'in työsopimusta jatketaan HuSArctic-hankeen loppuun saakka.

Leena Heinämäki on tehnyt mittavan työuran Lapin yliopistossa ja Arktisessa keskuksessa. Hän on tuottanut huomattavan määrän tutkimusartikkeleja ja luonut oman tutkimusverkostonsa (LIITE 1.). Heinämäki on myös hakenut aktiivisesti tutkimusrahoitusta ja hän johtaa tällä hetkellä Koneen säätiön rahoittamaa 1-vuotista 'Saisiko olla ympäristökonflikti soppaa? - hanketta. Heinämäki on väitellyt vuonna 2011.

Kamrul Hossain on tehnyt julkaisut huomattavan määrän vertaisarvioituja artikkeleja ja luonut oman tutkimusverkostonsa (LIITE 2.). Lisäksi hän opettaa vuosittain oikeustieteiden tiedekunnan maisteriohjelmassa. Hossain on ollut keskeisessä roolissa Lapin yliopiston ulkopuolisen rahoituksen hankkimisessä ja johtaa tällä hetkellä Suomen Akatemian rahoittamaa 4-vuotista HuSArctic-tutkimushanketta (1.1.2015–31.12.2018). Hossain on väitellyt vuonna 2007
