If our project is included as one of the flagship projects, we will gain visibility at the Baltic Sea / European level. However, it is not an automatic process – one needs to apply for being designated. Everyone recognized the importance of being included. Our project has already met the requirements to be included, but we still need to file an application. 	Christer and Kamrul will take the initiative to prepare the application.
Networking for the project	 It is important to identify the institutions dealing with societal security issues in the Nordic/Baltic region. In Norway, there are two universities dealing with societal security. We need to collect the info for cooperation purposes. Project's advisory board	 It is important to have an advisory board for the project. This requirement is included in our project application. Recruitment	 Arctic Centre has already recruited Mirva who will act as the main person in terms of research and coordination from the part of Arctic Centre. When feasible, there will be other possible recruitments. Sandra will work herself – and will be the main contact point for coordination with ISDP. Christer will also work himself and serve as the main contact point for UiT. Mike will employ a Research Assistant from the beginning of May 2017 onwards. Angelica's name should be taken off from UiT's team as she has got a new job. Research	 We committed 10 (when calculating differently the number is 16) articles to be published during the project. It should be realistic to have 10 articles, though. We probably could allocate two articles for each of the partners. We also have to write a synthesis report at the end. An edited volume with external contributors as well. HuSArctic theory article might serve as background info. Abstracts and drafts of articles to be circulated amongst the participants for commenting as part of quality assurance. 	 Eight articles primarily, but then we produce two additional ones. From each WP two abstracts will be submitted on the basis of which we prepare the articles. Kamrul will write a theme for the book and distribute it for comments. All participants should think of people to ask for a contribution. Each partner will contribute to the synthesis report. Kamrul will send the theory article written in HuSArctic project to the project participants.
