FROM THE DIRECTOR

Year 2012 witnessed perhaps one of the most significant milestones in the 23 year long history of the Arctic Centre as the EU Commission approved the EU Arctic Information Centre preparatory project. The Commission requested the Arctic Centre with its network of 19 European arctic expert institutions to carry out a strategic environmental impact assessment about the change in the European Arctic.

The project will be completed in summer 2014. After that it will be seen how feasible the idea of EU Arctic Information Centre as a network undertaking would be. Arctic Centre with its partners aims to improve information flow between EU and the Arctic.

This illustrates how the Arctic Centre is in the center of the Finnish Arctic debate, a position which gives us the possibility to maintain multidisciplinary Arctic research themes. Our specialists are in demand as experts and popular speakers in major global and domestic arenas. I too had the honor to participate in a state visit to Norway by the Finnish President Sauli Niinistö, to represent the Finnish Arctic expertise.

Arctic Centre works a lot with popularizing Arctic information and research to various audiences. We feel that this social influence is the best way to contribute to the sustainable development of the Arctic region. To demonstrate the media's role in science communication the Arctic Centre launched a big project for the Barents region's media collaboration.

Arktikum Science Centre attracts tourist from all over the world and works with students and school children in the region. In 2012, a big science centre project started involving the first nuclear icebreaker Lenin in Murmansk.

Our home base is the 20 years old Arktikum house where the public was given more Northern experiences when two art exhibition rooms were opened 2012. The galleries of the Faculty of Art and Design at the University of Lapland gave the

students possibility to present Arctic design and to organize various installation artworks.

Once again the Arctic Centre had a lot of visible popular activities and social influencing, diplomats and politicians visiting and events organized. However, the core and backbone of the Arctic Centre will always be in multidisciplinary cutting-edge research and communicating Arctic science.

The 2012 well-being survey of the University of Lapland showed that the staff at the Arctic Centre enjoy and appreciate their work and finds their organization to have a good public image. I firmly believe that the Arctic Centre's activities' richness, diversity, and unconditional support from colleagues as well as the positive atmosphere are the keys to success. Last year, the Arctic Centre really did an excellent result. And it was due to the excellent people working at the Arctic Centre.

RESEARCH

The Arctic Centre's research has achieved a solid respect in international research forum. The researchers were very successful in publication of high-quality scientific articles that were also referred in several international media. The success rate of competitive applications was also excellent.

During the year 2012 Arctic Centre has been working with a great number of national and international research projects across the Arctic. Arctic Centre's researchers have presented their studies in international conferences and publications as well as contributed their expertise in national and international boards.

The societal impact of the research of the Arctic Centre is good. The researchers have been involved in regional development strategies, and they participated actively also in preparation of reports of the Arctic Council, such as Arctic Resilience Report and Arctic Human Development Report.

Arctic Centre's professors and researchers participated in 37 short-term international exchanges and 6 long-term exchanges. In addition 6 foreign researchers worked in the Arctic Centre in a short-term exchange and 3 in a long-term exchange.

Arctic Centre's research focuses on three main themes. Each research group is led by a research professor and includes a multidisciplinary team of senior researchers, researchers, post-doc researchers, and PhD students.

Arctic Doctoral Programme (ARKTIS) is a multidisciplinary, network-based doctoral programme lead and coordinated by the Arctic Centre at the University of Lapland. ARKTIS educates doctoral level experts in Arctic issues. ARKTIS has 22 doctoral students enrolled at the universities of Lapland, Oulu, Eastern Finland and Helsinki. The disciplinary background of the ARKTIS doctoral students comprises both social sciences such as sociology, political science, environmental politics and international relations, economy, cultural studies, law and education and natural sciences, for example biology, chemistry, geophysics and geography.

By three applications, Arktis has got highly competed funding from Academy of Finland and the Ministry of Education and Culture for 14 full-time four-year PhD positions during 2003 - 2013 and have hired altogether 23 PhD students. Arktis has also offered support for educational activities, annual seminars, theme days, workshops, guest lectures and mobility for students. So far thirteen doctors have graduated from the programme and more will graduate in near future.

Examples of ARKTIS Activities in 2012

ARKTIS celebrated its 10th functioning year in 2012. Three doctoral dissertations were successfully defended and a wide variety of ARKTIS activities were organized. 12 ARKTIS travel grants were admitted to ARKTIS PhD students for participation in international scientific conferences for instance in Canada, Portugal, Switzerland, the UK, the USA and Russia.

The 10th Annual Research Seminar of ARKTIS, with the theme “Science-Policy Interface – Societal Impacts of Arctic Research” took place 15-16 March 2012 in Arktikum. The seminar was organized in collaboration with the “Knowledge in Environmental Planning and Decision-making” project, and the seminar served also as the final seminar of the project. The number of participants was 41, of which 15 were PhD students and 4 international senior scholars. In addition to academic audience, the seminar was attended also by decision-makers and planning professionals.

ARKTIS Theme Day for PhD students on March 14th offered PhD students an opportunity to learn practical skills such as designing posters for conferences and data management skills. Also tips for the final stages of the dissertation and getting prepared for the defense day were given.

In 2012, ARKTIS hosted several guest lectures by international scholars. The lectures were organized in collaboration with other units of the Arctic Centre and the University of Lapland.

Professor Sandra Harding, a famous philosopher of science from UCLA visited the Arctic Centre and the University of Lapland in October and gave five public lectures on epistemology, feminist research and post colonialism. The lectures were organized by ARKTIS in collaboration with the Unit for Gender studies and the Graduate School of the University of Lapland. Altogether about 200 researchers and PhD students participated the lectures.

ARKTIS workshop on Indigenous Knowledge Systems was organized 4 October in conjunction with Professor Sandra Harding's visit. Keynote lectures were given, in addition to Professor Harding, by Dr. Elina Helander-Renvall, Arctic Centre, University of Lapland and Professor Suvi Ronkainen, Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Lapland. The programme included also presentations by PhD students, feedback for the students from the keynote speakers and multidisciplinary discussions.

ARKTIS together with the Arctic Anthropology team had also other academic guests in 2012. Professor Nikolay Vakhtin, European University of St Petersburg, talked about Soviet, Western and Russian approaches to research cooperation with indigenous partners; the president of IASSA, professor Gail Fondahl, gave a guest lecture on land rights in Siberia and Northern Canada; and professor Enrique del Acebo Ibáñez from the Universidad del Salvador and University of Buenos Aires, Argentina, showed two of his documentary films and gave introductory lectures to them.

Also the opponent for Emilie Beaudon's doctoral dissertation, Adjunct prof. Christian M. Zdanowicz, Department of Geography of the University of the University of Ottawa, gave a lecture about "Transformations in the Canadian Arctic cryosphere: Placing observed changes in a long-term perspective."

A 2-days workshop on Barents International Political Economy was organized in 29-30 August by the Nordic network (funded by Nordforsk, coordinator professor Monica Tennberg, Arctic Centre) and ARKTIS at Arctic Centre. Keynote lectures were given by Dr. Wendy Larner, Bristol University, UK. Other speakers included eg. Dr. Aileen Espiritu, Barents Institute and Dr. Larissa Riabova and Dr. Vladimir Didyk Kola Science Centre, Russia. Also several ARKTIS PhD students presented their research.

PhD students of ARKTIS published altogether 18 scientific publications (of which 3 doctoral dissertations) and 4 popular publications.

ARCTIC STUDIES PROGRAM (ASP)

The Arctic Studies Program (ASP) is a multidisciplinary study program providing a possibility to specialize in the Arctic issues. It offers diverse knowledge on the physical, environmental, social and cultural aspects of the Arctic.

The program was coordinated by the Faculty of Social Sciences and the International Studies Coordinator at the University of Lapland's International Relations Office, and the teaching is provided mainly by researchers of the Arctic Centre. About 30–40 students participate in the ASP every year.

The ASP is 30 – 60 ECTS and it is offered as a core component of the education of the University of Arctic.

SCIENCE CENTRE

Chief Executive Producer Nicolas Gunsley

The Arktikum Science Centre has a great experimental and interactive permanent exhibition that popularizes Arctic information in various functional exhibitions, public events and international projects. Almost 78 000 persons visited the Arktikum house in 2012, half of them from abroad. The Arktikum is praised in international travel guides like Lonely Planet and TripAdvisor.

In the beginning of 2012, the Science Centre started to lead a transformation of the first nuclear icebreaker into a science centre. The Arctic Centre and its partners Polaria (in Tromsø Norway) and Atomflot (in Murmansk, Russia) were granted 1.2 million euros by Kolarctic ENPI CBC program to produce a science and historical exhibition on board Icebreaker Lenin. The project *Arctic Expo Centre – Nuclear-Powered Icebreaker Lenin – ICE* enables the partners to share expertise and to build a new science exhibition centre focusing on the Arctic.

In 2012 Arktikum Science Centre and Faculty of Art and Design strengthen their co-operation by starting a new shared position, Lecturer in Visual Culture Studies. In the autumn art students designed an element to Voyages Beyond in an exhibition planning course.



SCIENCE COMMUNICATIONS

Head of Science Communications Markku Heikkilä

The Science Communications unit is a leading expert in popularizing Arctic research and information, and sharing it with various audiences from local people to global arenas. While the audience of the Arctic Centre's Arktikum science centre exhibitions are such as kids, school pupils, tourists and local families, the Science Communications focuses on media and professional audiences like policy and decision makers, experts, researchers and businesses. It also approaches local community by organizing public discussions.

Multiple communication channels like weekly press releases, websites, newsletters, social media, databases, web portals and leaflets support the messages to reach the interest groups. The Science communications is responsible of the public relations of the Arctic Centre along with the Director. The Science communications is also testing innovative communication methods, such as publishing a book about travels to river Ob as a combination on photos and documentary poetry.

The Science Communications has special experience and knowledge in Barents information dissemination due to cooperation contract with the International Barents Secretariat (IBS) in Kirkenes and several Barents communications projects within the last ten years. Latest example of Barents communications cooperation is Kolarctic ENPI funded Barents Mediasphere project. The project is led by the Arctic Centre's Science Communications with partners from TV Murman from Russia and BarentsObserver from Norway. The aim of the two year project is to increase the visibility of the Barents Region by promoting cooperation between journalists and cross-border communication in the region.

The Science Communications organizes yearly dozens of events, seminars, lectures, symposiums etc. with research groups, science centre and other partners like Ministries and universities. The unit organizes Arctic Centre's visitors programs and presents Arctic Centre's activities to guests from all over the world on average weekly bases. Many of the Science communications staff writes Arctic and Barents related columns and articles for example in local newspapers and University's stakeholder magazine Kide.

LIBRARY

The Arctic Centre library at the Arktikum is open for tourists, researchers, students, local people and visitors of the Science Centre of the Arctic Centre, the Regional Museum of Lapland and the Pilke Science Centre of Metsähallitus (state owned company on forest and park service). During the year 2012 the library of the Arctic Centre carried on cooperation with the Science Communications and the research units by producing two book exhibitions. The first book exhibition dealt with the land law questions arising from the ILO Convention 169. The second book exhibition was based on the book collection donated by prof. Juha Pentikäinen. It dealt with northern languages and the “arctic mind”. The library organized together with the science communications two Barents café meetings at the library.

The library carried on cooperation with other partners at Arktikum and Pilke. A common media workshop for eight-graders was organized during the international museum week in May. A plant species identifying workshop was organized together with the science center in August. During the international Museum day in May and during the Rovaniemi day in September the library had extra opening hours and some program during the times Arktikum and Pilke had free entrance and special program for visitors.

In March the library moved from its previous premises to the previous Aurora meeting room next to the café.

ART GALLERIES VALO AND KATVE

The Faculty of Art and Design at the University of Lapland has two art galleries at the Arctic Centre in Arktikum. In the galleries students of the faculty and members of staff can present their art. The gallery spaces can also be hired by external parties.

In addition to art from what might be called the traditional fine arts, the gallery exhibits, among other things, industrial art and media-related productions.

In 2012 altogether 12 exhibitions or related productions were presented in VALO and KATVE galleries.

EU ARCTIC INFORMATION CENTRE INITIATIVE

The EUAIC initiative was made during years 2009 - 12 as the most experienced professional network of European institutions for information, outreach and insight into Arctic issues. It is made by an international network of 19 leading Arctic research and outreach institutions from the various European Union Members States, and the EEA countries.

The network's objective is to provide the European Union, its citizens, institutions, companies and Member States with an Arctic information source and factual overview about the status and trends in the Arctic. The EUAIC initiative network aims to act as a 'boundary organization' of information that facilitates two-way communication between experts, decision makers, stakeholders and the public.

The initiative is organized using a network model to operate on the basis of existing expertise and infrastructures of its network members. The network initiative has its headquarters located at the Arctic Centre (Rovaniemi, Finland). The initiative follows the Arctic statements of the European Union (Commission 2008 and the Council 2009) that have high importance for sustainable development of the Arctic regions.

The Network worked hard during the summer and the final application was submitted on 30.08.2012, 1 day before the deadline.

On November, 26th 2012, the European Commission represented by the Directorate-General Environment, Director of International Affairs, LIFE & Eco-Innovation Mr. Timo Makela, informed that 'your bid has been selected for the award of the procurement contract'. Our Tender Proposal has been accepted. Another necessary step towards establishment of the EU Arctic Information Centre was made. The contract was signed in December 19 and the project was launched.

ADMINISTRATION

The Arctic Centre has an international staff of arctic experts from more than 10 countries. There were about 80 people working at the Arctic Centre in 2012. Because of short term visiting contracts, there were approximately 50 person years done in 2012: Professors, researchers, students, communication experts, producers, coordinators and planners.






